**Zoom Lecture Disclaimer (In case of Zoom being used):** Our class sessions may be audio-visually recorded for students in the class to refer back to and for enrolled students who are unable to attend live. Publication without permission of the instructor is prohibited. To “publish” means to share, transmit, circulate, distribute, or provide access to a recording, regardless of format or medium, to another person (or persons), including but not limited to another student within the same class section. Additionally, a recording, or transcript of a recording, is considered published if it is posted on or uploaded to, in whole or in part, any media platform, including but not limited to social media, book, magazine, newspaper, leaflet, or third party note/tutoring services.
